Perhaps the following paragraph could be considered "Oral cancer, also known as mouth cancer, usually arises from the lining of the mouth and thus is amenable to detection by the dentist on a visual screening of the mouth. Alcohol and tobacco use are associated with the majority of such cancers, These risk factors can be assessed by the dentist. Unfortunately survival has not greatly improved over the last 30 years .Unlike many other cancers (which have shown a decline), oral cancer rates have trebled over the same time period"
