


MRCS Part B OSCE

Completing the modules will provide you with an overview of what examiners are looking for from candidates at the stations, with hints and tips of how to prepare.

Each scenario will require you to demonstrate different competencies, including your knowledge of anatomy, critical care, surgical pathology, and your communication skills. Mock OSCE exam

The mock OSCE exam is held at the Glasgow exam centre, the Golden Jubilee National Hospital. The mock exam is conducted under MRCS OSCE exam conditions and each station is marked by a current, senior MRCS OSCE examiner. You will receive in-depth feedback on your performance for each station undertaken.



Thorough preparation is key to success in the MRCS OSCE exam, candidates are permitted a maximum of four attempts to pass the exam.
